Religious Education

The Religious Education program is designed to train students to become Christian school teachers. From their first semester, Education majors will begin implementing weekly training in an actual classroom setting.

Education majors will take 36 credit hours in Bible, General Studies, and Elective courses alongside students in all majors, as well as taking 54 credit hours in Education courses. In addition, 1 credit hour is awarded each semester (for a total of 8) for supervised weekend ministry work. The program culminates with a full year of teaching in the Christian school as an intern.

The courses of study on the following pages are *recommended*. Individual courses may be taken in a different order than suggested with the registrar's approval and/or recommendation. Courses may at times be substituted for similar courses with the same academic prefix.
